MAJOR WORKS AND COMMISSIONS

2022: *One Heartbeat* - an immersive site specific, interactive arts experience using dance, song, tunes and musical sculptures, to inspire self and group expression. The interactive experience conveys its message by encouraging physical participation. The creation of One Heartbeat was assisted by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) American Rescue Plan (ARP) intended to support artists in their response to and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

2019: *Jump Shot* - commissioned by the Basin Dance Collective, this work blurs the line between dance and basketball in a playful yet competitive romp. Everyone is a winner. Created with support of an ARTSPARK grant from the Acadiana Center for the Arts.

2016: *Ground Fine* - a screendance delving into the complicated relationship between food and mood. This work was a part of a collaboration between choreographers and chefs, commissioned by Runaway Dish, Basin Arts, and the Acadiana Center for the Arts, Lafayette, Louisiana.

2013: *Knuck 'n Futz* - a classic vaudeville duet created for the World Buskers Festival in Christchurch, New Zealand, featuring musician, Rick Good and Cirque DuSoleil artist, Nate Cooper.

2013: Carry it on... - a screen dance focusing on the sacred power and potential of place and our relationship to it. Moving through, with and around open fields, a pine grove and an old stage, the cast of dancers and musicians explores humankind's relationship to the environment and our universal need to gather. This work was commissioned by the Wheatland Music Organization in Michigan, in celebration of their 40th anniversary.

2010: *Bolero* - the Zen of Tap; *Adieu Mes Amis* - a farewell work to the community of Dayton with original Cajun music, created for Rhythm in Shoes in collaboration with the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra and inspired by the paintings of Jack Vettriano.

2007: *The Wild Party* - dance theater to Milhaud's Le Boeuf sur le toit; *Ragtime Dance* - tapping to Scott Joplin; *Harvest Home* - old time dance theater with Jay Ungar & Molly Mason, created for Rhythm in Shoes collaboration with the Dayton Philharmonic.

2007: Banjo Dance: a Celebration of American Spirit - an evening length program surveying and celebrating the evolution of Appalachian culture (itself a fusion of British Isles, African and Native American cultures) from the 1880s to the 21st century, created for Rhythm in Shoes in collaboration with composer, Rick Good.

2006: RedScent - a concert tap work fusing North and South American rhythms.

2004: *Brandenburg Concerto* #3 - classical tap trio; *Brubeck's Take Five & Blue Rondo ala Turk* - dance theater work examining family dynamics; *Gershwin Suite* - ballroon/tap duets, created for Rhythm in Shoes collaboration with the Dayton Philharmonic.

2003 & 2004: *Doctor Goodfellows Traveling Vaudeville Entertainment* - a re-creation of vaudeville acts from the early 1900s, commissioned by the National Aviation Heritage Foundation for Dayton, Ohio's Centennial of Flight Celebration.

2002: William Tell Overture - physical comedy dance theater work; Morton Gould Tap Concerto - a recreation of 1952 score for tap dancer and orchestra, created for Rhythm in Shoes in collaboration with the Dayton Philharmonic orchestra.

2002: *Rambleshoe* - created for Rhythm in Shoes in collaboration with the Red Clay Ramblers of North Carolina, based on concepts of family and home, with support from the New England Foundation for the Arts and the National Dance Project. This work toured nationwide from 2003 through 2005.

2001: *Hoagland* - a study of character and situation (a constant theme in my work), inspired by the music of Indiana composer, Hoagy Carmichael, translated his classic melodies and rhythms to movement, interactions and visual exchange.

2000: *Walk With Me* - a 45-minute work in six movements with original music by Rick Good. Commissioned by Dayton Contemporary Dance Company, in memory of their founder, Jeryldine Blunden, who, through her unbending support, had a major impact on my life and career.

2000: *Nova Town* - a dance/music/theater piece created in collaboration with writer/composer Rick Good, and a cast of fifteen dancers, actors and musicians. The work fuses elements of film noir, science fiction, beat poetry and astrophysics to portray a slice of life as it is mirrored in the heavens; funded in part by the Dayton Foundation.

2000: *Harvest Home* - a dance theater piece with classically arranged music by Jay Ungar, commissioned by the University of Akron and Wright State University.

1999: *Time Shifts* - a look at our understanding and use of time, created in collaboration with Keith Terry and Crosspulse, funded by the National Endowment for the Arts and the New England Foundation for the Arts' National Dance Project. Premiered April 10, 1999, at Memorial Hall in Dayton, Ohio.

1997: *Do You Remember This?* -an evening length's work focusing on the passing of women's knowledge from one generation to the next, in collaboration with sound sculpture artist and musician Michael Bashaw, composer Rick Good and forty women of all ages from my community. The piece was funded through Cultureworks of Dayton.

1995: *Reach* - a modern, rhythmic work expressing multicultural themes of work, prayer and play, commissioned by Dayton Contemporary Dance Company, with music created by Rick Good.

1995: Baltimore Girls - a whimsical look at Catholic school girls.

1994: *Streets of the Capitol* - a work in three movements that examines the issues of civil war, commissioned by Jacob's Pillow in Massachusetts, the Flynn Theater in Burlington, Vermont and Cityfolk in Dayton, Ohio, funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, with music composed by Rick Good and Peter Sutherland.

1993: Water from the Well - incorporating gospel music and body rhythms, a collaboration with composer Rick Good and choreographer Keith Terry

1992: I Live.., created with the alternative rock band, the Horseflies, commissioned by Cityfolk of Dayton and funded through a New Work Grant from the Ohio Arts Council.

1991 – *Rhythmetic* - a contemporary, rhythmic work created through the study of the sacred geometric figure, the enneagram, and Baka Pygmy singing.
